REGISTRATION

Orientation begins at 5:30pm. It is important that you are in attendance regardless of which track you will be taking. We will introduce the faculty and staff as well as explain how the conference classes are set up. This will be beneficial as you make decisions on which classes you will want to attend. The 8-11 years will also be given instruction

PLACEMENT
